Why is this research important?

Interprofessional professionalism (IPP) is how we show core values, communication, respect, excellence, altruism & caring, while working in teams. **The Interprofessional Professionalism Assessment (IPA) is a short, behavior-based tool** to give clear, actionable feedback on teamwork behaviors. To use the IPA confidently in nursing education, we need to confirm that it measures these behaviors well among nursing students. Your responses help validate the tool so programs can teach and assess teamwork more effectively in clinicals and simulation, support the AACN Essentials (2021), and ultimately strengthen collaboration and patient care.

Who can participate?

- Prelicensure nursing student (e.g., BSN)
- Completed at least one clinical or simulation rotation
- Participated in an interprofessional (IP) clinical or simulation experience
- Proficient in English and able to complete an online survey

What will you do?

- Think about a recent interprofessional experience (clinical or simulation)
- Complete a brief online survey about teamwork and professionalism behaviors

Why does it matter?

- Validate a behavior-based tool aligned with the AACN Essentials (2021)
- Improve assessment of teamwork, communication, respect, and caring
- Help educators enhance interprofessional learning for future students
